

### **Family Day Pass – Camper/Family Policy Guidelines**

*When a camper donates their deposit amount or greater due to the cancellation of summer camp, their family receives a day pass. A family may only have 1 day pass per camper deposit (or more) donated. A Family day pass includes a day of activities between 9AM and 5PM that includes lunch. A “family” includes the camper and any family members in their immediate household. Programming is only designed for children going into kindergarten and older. Younger children may attend but they are the sole responsibility of the parent/guardians.*

- **General**
  - Family members will have a high-comfort room assigned for them to use that day for restroom, handwashing, and rest.
  - Each family will have their own assigned water cooler for the day.
  - Capacity is limited to 4 families per day but may be less due to total staff availability.
  - Due to dining restrictions, the family (household) cannot be more than 10 people.
  - Each attending family will be assigned a counselor for the day.
  
- **Pre Camp**
  - All family members attending will complete the Pre-Camp Health Screening and turn it in on Day 1 of camp and coordinate with full-time staff as necessary.
  - All family members will complete a health form and waiver of liability.
  - Campers may not bring toys, stuffed animals, blankets, books, devices, games, or any other extra recreational/leisure items to camp. We will only be using camp activity items that can be cleaned and sanitized easily.
  
- **Arrival**
  - Families will be greeted by the Family Camp Manager in the parking lot.
  - All family members will have their temperatures taken upon arrival and will be screened for symptoms by the Family Camp Manager.
  - The Family Camp Manager must wear a mask and gloves while checking family campers in.
  - Families will develop an activity schedule for the day with their counselor upon arrival.
  
- **Post-Camp**
  - If a camper experience symptoms or is diagnosed with COVID-19 within 14 days of the last day of their camp experience, please contact Camp lo-Dis-E-Ca so that it can be reported and documented. Additionally, campers in the cabin group and their families will be contacted to be alert for any symptoms and to report it as well.
