Camp Io-Dis-E-Ca COVID-19 Policy Guidelines

RISK

COVID-19 poses a threat to everyone. We advise campers, guests, and staff of the risk to contract it and the possibility that it could come home with them. Please understand those who are at most vulnerable to COVID-19 and the risks of contracting it. Those most vulnerable to COVID-19 are:

- People 65 years and older
- People of all ages with underlying medical conditions, particularly if not well controlled, including:
 - People with chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma
 - o People who have serious heart conditions
- People who are immunocompromised
 - Many conditions can cause a person to be immunocompromised, including cancer treatment, smoking, bone marrow or organ transplantation, immune deficiencies, poorly controlled HIV or AIDS, and prolonged use of corticosteroids and other immune weakening medications
- People with severe obesity (body mass index [BMI] of 40 or higher)
- People with diabetes
- People with chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis
- People with liver disease

New General Measures

Though these policy guidelines contain many measures, here are some that are being implemented that do not necessarily fall into the key areas of the guidelines.

- Signs posted across camp from the IDPH for social distancing, hand hygiene, etc.
 - At main entrances to Lodges & inside Lodges
 - Social Distancing
 - 3 C's
 - Cover Cough
 - Clean Hands
 - Contain Germs
 - o Bathrooms
 - Handwashing
- Hand Sanitizer bottles (with pumps) available throughout the main rooms in Lodges
 - Marked with a sign.
 - Dining Hall (2 Bottles)
 - Activity Hall (1 Bottle)
 - Fireside Room (1 Bottle)
 - Alpha Lodge Entryway (1 Bottle)
 - Staff Lounge (1 Bottle)
 - Main Office (1 Bottle)

- Omega Upstairs (1 Bottle)
- Omega Basement (1 Bottle)
- Masks available
 - All guests for tours and/or other visitors are invited to wear masks. Masks are available for guests to wear.
 - Kept in the main office.
- Staff Care
 - All non-residential camp staff have been informed to stay home if ill and report it to the Camp Director
 - All camp staff must have a daily health screening.
 - Temperatures checked at the beginning of each day with a non-contact thermometer.
 - Asked about any symptoms of COVID-19
